NCWIT needs volunteer application reviewers like you for three AiC Awards this 2018-19 season:

- the Award for AiC (for high school students)
- the AiC Educator Award (for high school educators)
- the NCWIT Collegiate Award (for college students)

It doesn't take much: volunteer reviewers complete application reviews at their own pace, and spend an average of three hours reviewing.

All individuals who are interested in encouraging girls and women in tech are welcome to volunteer, including eligible AiC Community members! [Note: technical people are particularly encouraged to volunteer for the NCWIT Collegiate Award.]
